## Al Quds Day 2022 Guide

It's back. Sauntering from the Home Office to Downing Street some time this afternoon, on the same route as in 2019, and for the <u>first time</u> since 2019.

Death to Israel and anti-semitism is scheduled to kick off at 3pm, but the arrogance of the Muslims organising it means they will move off when they are ready and not when the police expect. Except, with a bit of luck, they won't be able to move off when they like, because they are being 'accompanied'.

2019 was the first year the government proscribed the awful yellow and green flags supporting <a href="Hamas and Hezbullah.">Hamas and Hezbullah.</a>



Al Quds Committee issue the following guidance for Al Quds Day 2022:

- The march will start outside the Home Office. If you are using public transport: Please arrive using
  Westminster station (Jubilee line, Circle line, District line). Walk through Parliament Square onto
  Abingdon Street. Turn right onto Great Peter Street and then left onto Marsham Street. The Home
  Office building will be on your left-hand side.
- The march will end at Downing Street. Please leave using Westminster station (Jubilee line, Circle line, District line). Our stewards will direct you toward the station.
- If you feel unwell during the procession, please contact one of the stewards. Our stewards will get you
  the support you need.
- Be vigilant: If you see any suspicious activity please report it to one of our stewards or to a police
  officer. You can read our security advice here.
- Flags: participants are welcome to bring flags that show solidarity with the Palestinian cause. Flags displayed to show support for any proscribed (illegal) organisation will not be allowed.

Based on advice from the police and lawyers, please be aware that flying the Hizbullah or Hamas flags could lead to you being arrested as it may be interpreted as support for a proscribed group, as they are both proscribed organisations. Please also note that any public action or statement that is in support of any proscribed organisation can lead to you being arrested.

The organisers the <u>Islamic Human Rights Commission</u> have specifically said that these flags are not to be flown and warned that their presence may lead to arrest. I will see later when I get to Westminster whether that command has been obeyed, and if not what happens.
