This month is the 71st anniversary (August 13th) of the death of H.G. Wells, author of *The War of the Worlds*. It's also the 60th anniversary (24th) of the death of Ronald Arbuthnott Knox (*Who the hell is he? I hear you ask*). Knox, an English clergyman and writer, had his claim to fame in a much-forgotten BBC radio hoax in 1926. The broadcast, which predated Wells's more famous 1938 alien war hoax, was a simulated
