Impending P5+1 deal with Iran

Noted commentator Ehud Yaari has <u>effectively uninforcable</u> according to experts.

One major concession, Yaari said, is the issue of inspections of Iranian nuclear sites, which has long been a sticking point in the negotiations. According to Yaari, the US negotiators have given in to an Iranian demand that inspections are "managed" — in other words, there will be no surprise visits, only those that are pre-arranged and approved by the Iranian regime.

Despite repeated news reports claiming that a deal is virtually complete, Iran <u>expressed alarm</u> at the consequences of dropping sanctions against Iran. Dempsey argued that it would fund a more substantive terrorist endeavour, which is causing issues in various parts of the Middle East, most recently with Iran's alleged involvement in the funding of major <u>suggesting</u> that a nuclear deal would pave the way for future co-operation with Iran to rid the Middle East of violent extremism — a remarkable suggestion in view of the Islamist regime's seminal role in so violently stirring the Sunni-Shia divide!
