ISIS Threatens Zuckerberg and Dorsey

Gilad Shiloach writes in <u>suspended 125,000 accounts</u> "for threatening or promoting terrorist acts, primarily related to ISIS." Facebook has said that it works to ensure that <u>A February report</u> by George Washington University Program on Extremism said the amount of pro-ISIS content available on Twitter has been limited by account suspensions since last summer. Suspensions have also devastated the reach of specific ISIS-affiliated users who have been repeatedly targeted, the report said.
