
Record 61 million immigrants in U.S., 15.7 million illegally

Time for a pause on all immigration. Paul Bedard writes in the Center for Immigration Studies found that 45.3 million, or three-fourths of the 61 million, are legal immigrants and their children. The report out Monday notes that the so-called "Gang of Eight" immigration bill supported by GOP presidential candidate Sen. Marco Rubio would have doubled that number of legal immigrants.
