

Remembering Che Guevara Sayings on the Anniversary of His Death

"The negro is indolent and spends his money on frivolity and drink, whereas the European is intelligent and forward looking."

"My friends are friends only so long as they think as I do politically."

"To send men to the firing squad, judicial proof is unnecessary."

"What we affirm is that we must proceed along the path of liberation [Communism] even if this costs millions of atomic victims."

"If any person has a good word for the previous government that is good enough for me to have him shot."
